

ONE-STOP COMMITTEE REPORT

- The One-Stop Committee last met on December 8, 2022.
- Both OhioMeansJobs centers are on track to spend 100% of the PY22 budget by June 30, 2023. Partners in each county approved the transfer of funds between line items within each county's budget, without exceeding the current budget.
- The Ohio to Work initiative will end December 31, 2022, however, the YouScience online career assessment will remain available for use until December 31, 2023. YouScience has generated a lot of customer traffic for the OMJ centers.
- Ohio has over 1,000 participants enrolled in the RETAIN grant and is on target to meet its established goals. The grant is scheduled to end March 2025.
- Current monthly traffic trend reports were compared to last year's reports. Reports include in-person and virtual visits. Customer traffic continues to increase; the percentage between in-person and virtual visits remains the same.
- Workshops will be offered at the OMJ satellite once customer traffic increases.
- Success stories of customers utilizing services at the OMJ centers in both counties were shared.
- The Area 17 One-Stop Operator contract will be monitored in January. The results will be presented to the Executive Committee to determine if a one-year contract renewal is appropriate for consideration.
- A new two-year One-Stop Partner MOU will take effect July 1, 2023. Partners were asked to notify the One-Stop Operator of any participation or signatory changes.
- The next One-Stop Committee meeting is scheduled for March 9, 2023.

WDB EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORT

- The Executive Committee last met on November 17, 2022.
- The Committee approved changes to WDB Administrative Policy 6: *Monitoring and Oversight*, WDB Program Policy 6: *Supportive Services Attachment 1*, and WDB Program Policy 13: *Youth Services Exit and Follow-Up Procedure* as discussed.
- The Committee approved the transfer of up to 100% of the local Area 17 PY21/FY22 and PY22/FY23 formula funding allocation between Adult and Dislocated Worker Programs, in compliance with State policy WIOAPL 15-25. If the transfer exceeds 50%, a request will be made for the State to approve the transfer.
- The local Area 17 OMJ website is being updated, and a preview will be available soon.
- Outreach efforts are having an impact on the youth population. A waiting list has been implemented for the in-school youth. Funding for out-of-school youth is 60% spent. These funds must be 100% spent before PY22 funds can be used.

- The OMJ satellite at Oak Hill has reopened, and customers are coming in for services. An increase in customer traffic is expected when the MCDJFS office opens to the public next year.
- The annual MCTA in-service day was held on November 11th. Staff received active shooter response training in the morning and de-escalation training in the afternoon.
- The 10.18.22 WDB meeting evaluation form was reviewed. Comments were positive, and members enjoyed the open discussion.
- Members with low meeting attendance were contacted. Some were able to attend the meeting or send a proxy on their behalf. Others indicated they would not be able to serve on the Board any longer due to time constraints at work.
- The Committee approved the subrecipient risk assessment form as completed by the WDB staff.
- Issues pertaining to the ARIES case management system are slowly being resolved. More State staff have been hired to address the concerns and gain more systematic control over how local areas are notified about corrections made to the system. Access to the CFIS client-tracking and finance system will eventually be accessed the same way as ARIES, which may have an adverse impact on areas if errors occur.
- The Ohio WDB Directors will be selecting an evaluator to assess CCMEP for the State.
- A letter of support was provided to the Columbiana County Board of Developmental Disabilities for its application of the Pathways to Careers grant. If awarded, the grant funding will be used to help increase the number of youth with disabilities who participate in and receive industry-recognized credentials.
- The next Executive Committee meeting is scheduled for February 16, 2023.

YOUTH COMMITTEE REPORT

INDIVIDUALS WITH DISABILITIES COMMITTEE REPORT

- The Individuals with Disabilities Committee last met on October 13, 2022.
- Sydney Williams, Chief Development Officer of New Day Recovery, provided an overview of services available. New Day Recovery is an inpatient treatment program, which offers recovery housing, counseling, and staffing services to help individuals find full-time work while in recovery.
- By the end of Quarter 2 under the Fresh Start grant, MCTA provided information and assistance to 38 employers and provi
- The Opportunities for Ohioans with Disabilities (OOD) Jobs for Recovery program has been implemented in Mahoning County. Under the program, OOD representatives work with various drug courts to assist individuals with previous or pending charges by offering counseling and job development.

- A statewide RETAIN meeting was held to discuss the expansion of eligible diagnoses. Currently, acute musculoskeletal and cardiac conditions are eligible; conditions related to mental health and gastric bypass are being considered.
- The suggestion was made to invite representatives from the Ohio Department of Commerce to present information about the Recovery Within Reach program. The program focuses on educating consumers about the financial impact of opioid misuse and how to get help.
